

### National Pitch Competition

Midland Institute hosted a pitch competition where students would submit their 30 second business pitch video to compete against other CEO programs from around the country. After reviewing nearly 400 submissions, judges chose the Top 18 Finalists as well as 12 Honorable Mentions.

For the first time in program history, we had two students earn honors in this competition. Baylie Roberts was selected as a Top 18 Finalist for her business E&K Alliances, where she produces sensory boards for autism. James Gillihan earned Honorable Mention for his business R&R Restoration, where he cleans and seals concrete.




